



Fishing Report – Courtesy Damian Kerves

Chicken fillets and mullet are accounting for some solid bream during the evening off the Empire Bay Wharf. Barry Suckling found bream to 1kg anchored at Half-Tide Rocks. Umina Point is providing anglers with a great late afternoon bite on salmon and tailor. Try a night session at Narara Creek during the out-going tide with live mullet or yellowtail for school mulloway to 6kg. Mosquito Bay is holding good numbers of bream with pilchard tails the most productive bait.

Try drifting near the Hawkesbury road bridge for flathead with local prawns and half-pilchards. Some large bream have come from the middle of the reef off Bar Point.

Rose Bay has bream, trevally and school mulloway biting on prawns and live nippers. Moey Darich fished during the evening at Greenwich with his brother-in law, Alan, for mulloway to 7.9kg using live yellowtail and squid strips. Drifting the Lane Cove with soft plastics and whitebait should get you among the flathead.

Good bream and whiting are available at the Goal Posts in Botany Bay with live nippers and prawns proving too tempting. Work the run-up tide at night on Watts Reef for your chance of a good bream. Big numbers of trevally are still coming in from the breakwall with the odd bonito and small kingfish also pouncing on half pilchards fished behind the boat.

Justin Walker teamed up with Tony Montana to fish Port Hacking. Using live worms, nippers and peeled prawns, the duo took home a nice bag of whiting, bream and salmon.

Bonnet Bay produced big whiting for Gabe Quercigrossi and Rod Walker using live blood worms.

Lake Iyell has a few trout on the prowl. Adam Camilleri caught a 39cm rainbow trout trolling a small hard-bodied lure, while other anglers are catching their rainbows fishing from the bank with Power Bait.

Rock anglers are again reminded to take care this weekend with huge swells predicted. The higher rock platforms are a much safer option in times of rough seas.
